From the Desk *of* Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Advent is upon us! How is that possible? As we ponder these days of Advent, What are you waiting for? Most people, I suspect, would say, very simply, we're waiting for Christmas, the birth of Jesus.

But the scriptures over the last couple of weeks suggest that answer isn't completely accurate. Beyond celebrating the birth of Jesus in the Nativity, we are also waiting for and anticipating His coming at the end of time. We are waiting for Christ to come – not just as a baby in a manger, but as a king in the clouds.

We're waiting for our final judgment, the concluding event of history. This isn't really a time for sentiment, but for searching—searching our hearts, making choices.

Advent by its very name itself calls attention to the great event described in today's gospel: the Latin word "adventus" is actually a translation of the Greek "parousia," which refers to Christ's second coming. It's Christianity's most anticipated event. As we pray at every Mass: "We wait in joyful hope for the coming of our savior Jesus Christ."

Advent calls us to be watchful. To be ready. To be holy. "Be vigilant at all times," Jesus told his followers. Do not grow complacent. Don't let your heart become drowsy from the anxieties of life.

In our own time, that isn't easy. We are constantly distracted— and overwhelmed.

Which brings us back to the great question of Advent:

What are you waiting for?

What are we all waiting for?

God bless you.

The Rite of Acceptance

For the last several weeks, a group of inquirers (people interested in the Catholic Church) have been meeting with the RCIA team here at St. Joseph Parish. During this time they have explored their own faith journeys and whether the Catholic Church is the place to continue that journey. They have prayed about it and have decided to take the next step. This step involves a liturgical rite: the *Rite of Acceptance* (for the unbaptized) and the *Rite of Welcome* (for the baptized). They will "assemble publicly for the first time declaring their intention to the Church and the Church, in turn, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members." (*Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, 41*)

We, the members of St. Joseph Parish, as the Church, have a part in this Rite. We are asked to warmly welcome these catechumens and candidates into our faith family and to support them with our prayers.

This Rite will take place on Sunday, December 4 at the 8:30 am Mass. We ask you to prayerfully and joyously participate in this Rite. And please keep all of us, catechumens, candidates, parish sponsors, and team, in your prayers.

The Devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus

This particular devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus, based on the life and writings of Sister Marie of Saint Peter, was approved by Pope Leo XIII in 1885 who established the devotion as an Arch-confraternity for the whole world. Begun by an act of Love and Mercy on the way to Calvary, a woman steps from a throng of people to offer her veil as loving compassion to JESUS. He receives her gesture of Love and in return, His Face is imprinted forever, revealing His Passion and Sacrificial, Eternal Love and Mercy for us. Saint Veronica, pray for us!

It is from this one moment that our Lord now requests us now to step out, with Him to make reparation to our Eternal Father for the sins against the first three Commandments. Through this devotion, Blessed Pope Pius IX said, "Reparation is a divine work, destined to save society." Our own Saint Louis IX was the crusader against blasphemy. The Veil of the Holy face was preserved and protected by Pope Saint Clement (93-102) during the persecutions. The medals were cast with the Holy Face by authority of Innocent III in the 12 century. The Holy Face was placed in the Basilica of

Saint Peter by Urban VIII on December 23, 1625. During Eucharistic Adoration, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass "suspended," we can honor His Holy Face as we adore, repent, give thanks and plead for His Mercy for ourselves, others, and the world. There is a specific Chaplet of Reparation to the Most Holy Face of Jesus that can be found here: Holy Face Novena. "Let us see Your Face, O Lord, and we will be saved." Psalm 80:4
