1ST SUNDAY OF LENT



From the Desk *of* Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I'm writing this letter from inside an airplane on a layover in Milwaukee on my way back to Imperial on Tuesday, February 22nd. I took a Presidents' Day, pre-Lenten weekend retreat/respite/break at a monastery just south of Big Sur, CA on Highway 1, the New Camaldoli Hermitages. Totally awesome. Incredibly beautiful!

That said, tomorrow is Ash Wednesday and I am really excited about Lent 2023. I hope you are too. One of the graces of the weekend for me was that I strongly felt the Lord asking me to dwell in an unshakable peace.

During this Lenten season, I invite all of you to do the same. By nature of our respective baptisms, we are claimed for the Church by our Heavenly Father to be His and His Alone. If we remain close to God in prayer, we can live in a way where we totally configure ourselves to Christ Jesus in all we say and do.

With that said, a phrase that has been occurring to me as I ponder the past weekend is "idle chatter," according to the writings of St. Teresa of Avila. Don't we all fall into it. The Devil loves idle chatter and the ways in which it distracts us from Jesus.

From a popular blog, the following:

"As St. Teresa said, "True humility is being satisfied with what God has given us."

We must look upon and really examine ourselves. The gifts, talents, and even the beauty given to us, are strictly that—gifts from God. He gives to whom He wills, as He wills. Our shortcomings and failures are our own. When we separate ourself from God, the giver of all gifts and graces, we become dependent upon ourselves and the things of this world. We busy ourselves with passing nonsense, idle chatter, and shallow, fruitless endeavors.

Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 22, 2023), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 7, 2023) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

Feast of Saint Patrick (March 17, 2023) falls on a Friday during Lent this year. Feasts of the Church are meant to be a day of celebration and rejoicing, so on this Friday, March 17, 2023, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis are dispensed from abstaining from meat should they choose to celebrate the Feast of Saint Patrick.


