

Pastor's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On June 24, 2022, the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade. Following are excerpts from a wonderful article by Will Wright on his blog, <u>https://catholic-link.org/roe -v-wade</u> -overturned-now-the-hard-work-begins/

"A Moral Imperative, not a Political Cudgel:

Ending abortion as a practice is a moral imperative, not a political cudgel to be wielded. This fight is not primarily about policies; it is about objective and clear right and wrong. Abortion is the intentional killing of an innocent human being. There is no gray area here. There are no special cases. There are no circumstances under which abortion, as the intentional and direct killing of a pre- born human person, is moral.

We must not be sucked into the false notion that we are "forcing our beliefs" on anyone. Of course, I think it providential that Roe v. Wade was overturned on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. Of course, I believe that this the will of God, in our Lord Jesus Christ and by the intercession of our Blessed Mother. Of course, it is. However, this fight has full force purely on the natural and scientific level. Being pro-life is being pro-science.

The Roe v. Wade decision would not venture to say when life begins. We know this fact of biology today with certitude: life beings at conception. From the first moment of fertilization of a human egg by a human sperm cell, a new human being has been made. This new person has distinct and unique DNA from the mother or the father. They are a unique, unrepeatable human person with inestimable worth. Simply growing bigger or developing or changing location from inside to out- side the womb does not change the ontological nature of that specific human being. Do not allow someone to say that you are motivated in this regard by your "oversedous" religious farver. Say with truth

regard by your "overzealous" religious fervor. Say with truth and clarity that you are following the science and good philosophy. Mother Teresa on "Roe v. Wade"

On the ruling of Roe v. Wade, St. Teresa of Calcutta ("Mother Teresa") had the following to say: "America needs no words from me to see how your decision in Roe v. Wade has deformed a great nation. The so-called right to abortion has pitted mothers against their children and women against men. It has sown violence and discord at the heart of the most intimate human relationships.

It has aggravated the derogation of the father's role in an increasingly fatherless society. It has portrayed the greatest of gifts a child as a competitor, an intrusion, and an inconvenience. It has nominally accorded mothers unfettered domination over the independent lives of their physically dependent sons and daughters.

And, in granting this unconscionable power, it has exposed many women to unjust and selfish demands from their husbands or other sexual partners. Human rights are not a privilege conferred by government. They are every human being's entitlement by virtue of his humanity. The right to life does not depend, and must not be declared to be contingent, on the pleasure of anyone else, not even a parent or a sovereign."

Of course, Mother Teresa is correct. Roe v. Wade has deformed our great nation. Now that it is overturned, it is time to reform. This is where the hard work begins! Now, each state will be responsible for evangelizing the culture to be a culture of life.

Each state MUST ensure that women have a real choice for life by opening and supporting crisis pregnancy centers, making an adoption a viable option, supporting domestic violence shelters for women and children, supporting social programs and outreach to those who need assistance, providing solid postnatal care for women with minimal means, and providing education and empowerment for new fathers."

So may we work and pray together with renewed fervor! Jesus and Our Blessed Mother are calling us all to labor untiringly in the vineyard to support a culture of life.


Results from the Disciple Maker Index Survey

Recently the Archdiocese of St. Louis published in the *St. Louis Review* the results of the Disciple Maker Index survey for the Archdiocese as a whole. Almost 71,000 surveys were submitted and the results may be viewed at <u>http://allthingsnew.archstl.org/dmi-results</u>. In our parish, 782 surveys were submitted, respresenting 72% of the average Sunday mass-going parishioners.

The Parish leadership committee that has been working on *All Things New* has had a chance to review both the Archdiocesan results and the results for St. Joseph Parish, and presents this synopsis of strengths and opportunities for our parish. On many measures, our parish and the results for the entire Archdiocese are in very close alignment.



Strengths




Top 3 by Highest Percentage "Monthly or More Often"





AN INVITATION FROM RCIA


