FROM THE DESK of FR. JACK RUZICKA, ASSOCIATE PASTOR

To the Parish Family of St. Joseph:

I want to be honest and straightforward about myself and what's happening with the new parish structure.

People call me "Father" - and rightly so - but to be honest, I still feel like a child. In my mind, this can be a good thing. We are all children in God's eyes. In the words of St. Augustine: "With you, I am a Christian. For you, I am a shepherd." I am both a child of God and a Spiritual Father. I can only be a father because I am first a son. I must admit, however, that adjusting to the priesthood has been far from easy for me. I would liken myself to the boy David before going out to meet Goliath. They tried to vest him in the armor of a soldier, but it was too big and awkward for him. Sometimes that's how I feel, vested with the responsibilities of the priesthood. They are heavy at times and I am awkward. I am still learning how to embrace the responsibility of being a father and a leader. I cannot express how grateful I am for the patience and generosity so many of you have extended to me over these past two years. I don't talk enough about how much I love being a priest. Not just a priest in general, but your priest. I absolutely love it.

Continuing in this spirit of honesty and vulnerability, I am intimidated about what the coming months hold for me, Fr. Shaughnessy, and Msgr. Mikesch. I know my workload will increase drastically as I navigate flip-flopping between two parish campuses, a high school, and dealing with my own "stuff." I'm scared at what will be demanded of me. Can I live up to it? Will I break? In the face of this fear, I am tempted to inordinately self-preserve and complain. However, I will not let this fear overshadow the love I have for Jesus Christ and the Catholic community of Imperial.

I am comforted by these words from St. Thérèse of Lisieux. In her autobiography, she writes, "When God stretches out His hand to ask, His hand is never empty; and His intimate friends can draw from Him the courage and strength they need." God's hands are never empty when he calls upon us to make a greater act of self-gift. Our hands, however, must be empty in order to receive what Jesus wants to give us. I cannot receive the grace of God if I cling to earthly comforts

and to what is familiar. Nothing is lacking where everything is given. Both communities have sacrifices to make.

I call upon the people of St. Joseph to develop a deep and sincere empathy for the changes that are taking place at St. John the Beloved. Change is never easy. Personally, it took time for me to learn that "SJBD" isn't just a "parish out there somewhere," but it is a community of people — real people whom I've come to know and love already. We are talking about the salvation of souls — the souls of people who need to be loved.

I likewise call upon the people of St. John the Beloved to understand that St. Joseph is affected by these changes much more than you'd think. St. Joseph is not "off the hook." Our parishioners need to accept that and buckle up for some things to look different. St. John the Beloved is not "an extra burden tacked on." This is not a take-over. This is a joint mission for the one thing necessary: the glory of God and the salvation of souls. These two items are inseparable.

"Despite life's countless changes, the Cross stands firm." Jesus Christ never changes! I can't wait for August 1st. I want to get started. I want to serve and I want my heart to grow. I want to share not only the Gospel, but my very self. I guarantee that I will stumble and fall along the way – but I know the mercy of God is inexhaustible. God is not limited by our littleness.

Did I mention that I love being your priest?! I know I speak for both Fr. Shaughnessy and Msgr. Mikesch. Let's do this together. Come, Holy Spirit!

God love you and bless you!

Announcement Regarding Mass Intentions

As you will note if you refer to the **Interim Schedule of Services** at the left, although the Mass schedule is only minimally impacted at St. Joseph Parish, there are ramifications for Mass intentions that have already been scheduled. If you have requested a Mass that is impacted by these schedule changes, we will reach out to you to reschedule.

There are two situations that will require changes. The first is that we will no longer offer a Monday morning 8 am Mass. However, we will be adding a Wednesday evening 6:30 pm Mass. Those who hold Mass intentions for Monday at 8 am will be offered the Wednesday 6:30 pm the same week, or can choose from any other available opening.

The second situation is, you may or may not be aware that Canon Law requires a pastor to celebrate a Pro Populo Mass, a Mass "for the people" on each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. As of August 1, Fr. Dan Shaughnessy becomes pastor of St. John the Beloved Disciple Parish in addition to pastor of St. Joseph Parish. Canon Law stipulates that a single Mass satisfies the pastor's obligation to celebrate a Mass for all parishioners. As a result, changes will need to be made to some already-scheduled Mass intentions as we create a Pro Populo rotation between the two parishes. What this means is you may have already booked a Mass intention that needs to be moved. If you have a scheduled Mass at a time that is designated to be a Pro Populo Mass, you will be able to accept the exchange with the former Pro Populo Mass time. Parish Administrative Assistant Rachel Schoenberger will help you understand your options.

WHAT IS AN ACOLYTE?

In the Roman Catholic Church a person is installed in the ministry of Acolyte in order to assist the deacon and the priest in liturgical celebrations, especially the Eucharistic Liturgy. You may have noticed an extra person serving at the altar at some of the Masses the last couple of months. Dan Darian, a St. Joseph parishioner, is one of 15 men entering their 5th year of diaconate formation for the Archdiocese of St. Louis. All received the Rite of Acolyte in May of this year and will be ordained to the Permanent Diaconate in June of 2024. Please pray for these men in the diaconate formation and for all vocations.


