From the Desk *of* Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear St. Joseph Parish Family,

As always, there are lots of things going on at St. Joseph Parish. We have entered the Season of Lent and the spirit of prayer, discipleship and accompaniment in our community is alive and well. We are truly disciples making disciples. If you have not invited anyone to join you for Mass, a Fish Fry, PSR, a small faith group/Bible study, Saint Joseph School or St. Joseph Athletic Association, to name a few, please consider extending that warm welcome to a friend, neighbor, family member, coworker, or friend.

And as we prepare for the implementation of *All Things New* and tentatively anticipate combining with St. John the Beloved Disciple Parish, we have been imagining what the future of our campus and facilities might look like as we continue to accommodate growth.

In the meantime, as we plan and imagine, we are considering a multi-faceted project that would allow our ministries to grow and thrive in the next 3 years. In the coming months, we will begin master-planning for a long-overdue St. Joseph Church renovation and we will continue to study the viability/necessity of an addition to Saint Joseph School behind the gymnasium.

Current Needs

With all that said, the current needs are the following:

- a) Allowance for continued growth in our Junior Kindergarten and Pre-K3 programs.
- b) Allowance for St. Joseph Youth Ministry to move back to its intended home on the 2nd floor of Holy Family Hall (Upper Bridge Building).
- c) Allowance for the aftercare program to move back to its intended home on the 1st floor of Holy Family Hall (Lower Bridge Building).
- d) Accommodations for the St. Joseph auction committee and Sr. Christine's Food Pantry to have space

in the 2nd floor space over the food pantry.

e) Allowance for the Saint Joseph School music program to have a dedicated classroom.

Currently, a committee is in the schematic design stage with an architect for a proposed project. The proposal is as follows:

- 1) St. Joseph Parish owns a 5 bedroom, 3 ½ bath residence at 1826 Valley Ridge Drive, at most ¼ mile from St. Joseph Church. It was recently vacated by the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (ASCJs) when they purchased their own convent. The Sisters are very grateful for the opportunity to have rented this home from the parish for the past four years. The priests and deacon would relocate to this residence, freeing up the rectory to be renovated for Junior Kindergarten and Pre-K3 classrooms.
- 2) The Eucharistic Adoration Chapel would remain in the existing rectory building.
- 3) The renovated rectory and garage would be able to accommodate 4 classrooms of 20 children each and 1 classroom of 10 children for a total of 90 children. In the lower level of Holy Family Hall, 20-30 children could be accommodated. The teacher/child ratios and opportunities will be honored with this potential growth. As the parish has grown significantly over the last several years, the exterior areas surrounding the rectory have been adapted to serve as playgrounds and demonstration gardens for our Pre-Kindergarten and primary school programs. Hence, modifying the rectory which was completely modernized in 2018 will be quite an easy and logical thing to do. The garden remains open to all students as the cafeteria and gym remain open for use for all students when the schedule allows.
- 4) Moving the Pre-Kindergarten classrooms from the school building to the existing rectory will free up 3 classrooms in the school, currently being used by



Pre-Kindergarten. Making this move will allow us to add a 3rd Kindergarten (if needed) for the 2023-24 academic year, leaving another classroom for a dedicated Music Room and one flex room to accommodate growth. Enrollment trends show continued/sustained growth.

- 5) The proposed cost of the changes to the rectory would be \$350K-\$400K as compared to the cost of a full addition to the school (behind the gym or somewhere else on campus) that would cost in the range of \$3,500,000. The larger-scale school addition was schematically drawn as part of our Master Planning exercise 5 years ago. It may be needed down the road but we do not need it now; this will buy us 3 years. We can reassess further down the road. In the meantime, the church renovation planning and upgrades will hopefully commence this calendar year.
- 6) Doing this intermediate step (of moving Pre-Kindergarten to the rectory building) may or may not eliminate the need for a school addition down the road. What this renovation/expansion will allow us to do is to buy some time to see how everything shakes out after *All Things New*.

Once the viability of the project is fully assessed and approved by the Archdiocese, we would ask for the approval to proceed with the relatively minor scope of construction, so that the project would be ready for the 2023-24 school year.

The proposal is high-impact in terms of space gained, while at a relatively low cost. It will involve shuffling of some spaces and their corresponding functions. One of our driving goals for this proposal is to meet a foundational objective: St. Joseph Parish is committed

to maintaining a single-site solution for all ministries related to the school at all grade levels, our PSR program, and our youth ministry programs, focusing on safety, convenience, and overall efficacy of mission and fiscal responsibility.

For this project, we will not be asking you for contributions, though we of course welcome them. But I would ask that you start praying about the capital campaign that we will conduct in the next 3 years to renovate and expand the St. Joseph Church building. (And as a matter of reference, please note that related to places of worship in the proposed "pastorate" of St. John the Beloved in Imperial and St. Joseph Parish in Imperial, there will be two worship sites).

Some may ask, "Why are we messing up the rectory/ tearing out some walls after we just did an expansion/ renovation of the building that was completed in August 2018?" It's a fair question. The following big picture question was asked by me to those on the Finance Council and the design committee: "What could we move off campus to allow for expansion of our disciple-making programs from Pre-K to Youth Ministry to PSR to Junior Kindergarten, etc.?" The obvious answer was the rectory. Since we already own the beautiful residence at 1826 Valley Ridge Drive, the answer was given to us on a silver platter, so to speak. All those serving our parish remain in close proximity to their ministry. What a blessing! How providential!

Nearly all of the construction and modifications done to the current rectory in 2018 would have had to be done to accommodate the building for Junior Kindergarten and Pre-K3. Back in 2018, all the building interiors

were taken down to studs and all systems were completely redone. Nearly all of that construction remains intact. Changes to accommodate the new usages will be: a) Upgraded doors and security at entry locations, b) A fire suppression system for safety, c) Removal of just 2 of the existing bathrooms and d) A covered canopy/walkway space to link the building to the existing school. The bathroom vanities and equipment will be used elsewhere on campus.

Planning for Growth

In anticipation of the 2023-24 school year, we have interest in St. Joseph Parish from South City, South County and all over Jefferson County. Things are going very well here in Imperial and we want to be able to continue to accommodate our growing Catholic Christian community. We also want to welcome any/all children from near and far, should they choose to come to St. Joseph for any of our catechetical or ministry programs. That having been said, quite frankly, we need this project to sustain our own current parish-based growth but with the growth in the region, we feel that this is a smart and well-calculated move for the parish in the next 3-5 years.

I ask all of you to continue to pray that St. Joseph Parish is a center for discipleship and evangelization in Christ Jesus! Let's all pray through the intercession of St. Joseph the Worker for the continued growth and success of this wonderful parish community.






Easter hams needed for Sr. Christine's Food Pantry






