

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at St. Joseph,

Easter Blessings to all of you! I've been praying a lot with Pope St. John Paul II and much like last week, I decided to share his words with you today. The following is from his April 11, 2004 *Urbi et Orbi* address:

"Resurrexit, alleluia - He is risen, alleluia!"

This year too the joyous proclamation of Easter,

which echoed powerfully at last night's Vigil,

strengthens our hope.

"Why do you seek the living among the dead?

He is not here, but has risen" (Lk 24:5-6).

Christ is risen, Christ is alive among us!

His name now is "the Living One",

God allows suffering to draw us closer to Him. It's not a punishment. Rather, I daresay it's a loving embrace.




