From the Desk *of* Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is hard to believe that we are already at the middle of October, the 29th Week of Ordinary Time. Where has this year gone?

In meditating on today's Gospel, I think we often reflect that "our lives are (like) one long instant in which we feel that something important is missing. We constantly feel that we are lacking something, something that we desire. Sometimes it is not very clear; we are not sure what it is that we are looking for. Still, the desire impels us to keep looking.

Sometimes this instant can be terrible. We almost feel like we are dying, like something essential to life is missing. Some tire and die. They die on the inside while on the outside they continue to live. Others continue to gasp for air. They want to breathe; they still hope and trust that they can find what they are looking for. Like the widow in today's Gospel, we too feel like something fundamental is missing. The widow had lost her sustenance, her base. She has lost the person that gave her life, that sustained her. In this image of the widow, Luke certainly identifies the experience of the community who has lost her spouse. It is the community who has lost Christ. It is a time of darkness and dismay. But it is also a time for combat.

With the conflict between the widow and the judge, Luke draws up a picture of the skirmish between man and God. In the dark moments of confusion, God often seems like an unsettling judge that refuses to listen to us. It is the battle between Jacob and the angel where we are left wondering over who won and who lost. The only way to endure in this battle is to keep desiring. In his commentary on Psalm 37, Saint Augustine wrote: Your continuous desire is your continuous prayer. To pray without tiring means to never stop desiring, even when we feel that life has abandoned us or stopped listening to us.

Or perhaps it would be better to say to pray without becoming embittered. In fact, that risk of the widow – and of each one of us – is that of becoming bitter or nasty. It's easy to do so when we do not feel listened to by others or by God when we feel frustrated. This frustration can easily turn into anger and violence.

Just like desire, prayer is wasted time, gratuitous time, time that we offer so that someone else can freely fill it. Prayer is that space in which desire dominates time. To pray means to pause without allowing time to dominate us. This is the meaning behind the monastic prayer of the liturgy of the hours. Time is not allowed to sweep us away, rather it is prayer that gives time its order and rhythm. In and through prayer, Christ returns time to its order. In prayer, we reaffirm the primacy of God over time.

On the contrary, waiting without prayer, without desire, cannot help but embitter us! Why do we cease to desire? Maybe because of belief that there is no time left to desire, or because we are convinced that the time of desire has passed." Dear Father,

I, like you, am deeply saddened by the death and devastation that Hurricane Ian has caused, first in Cuba and the Dominican Republic, and then in the southeastern part of the United States beginning in Florida. In addition to the loss of life, we have seen thousands of homes, businesses, and churches severely damaged or destroyed. This was in the wake of Hurricane Fiona, which caused havoc and devastation across Puerto Rico and other parts of the Caribbean just days earlier. The impacts will be long lasting. I ask the Lord to carry those suffering in the aftermath.

To help provide immediate and long-term aid to those recovering from these disasters, I am asking our 178 parishes in 11 counties to participate in a second collection at all Masses the weekend of October 15th and 16th, 2022. The funds collected in this special appeal will become part of the Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund and will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and/or Catholic Relief Services, the office relief agencies of the U.S. Catholic Church, to support the Church and humanitarian needs arising from this and any future disasters. We join other dioceses across the country in this response for support to help with water, food, shelter, and sanitation, along with long-term rebuilding and recovery efforts. The funds will be distributed where they are most needed.

This paragraph was deleted regarding the submission of funds to the USCCB.

I will be offering a Mass for those who died in these tragedies, as well as those injured and suffering at this widespread devastation. Please pray for our brothers and sisters who have suffered as a result of Hurricanes Ian and Fiona, who must now rebuild their lives, their homes, their cities, and their churches.

All Things New Listening Sessions: Date Announced!

Thanks to all of you who have participated in the All Things New surveys and provided data and feedback over the past few months. The information has been enlightening, educational and fruitful as we continue to ask ourselves what our parishes, ministries and institutions need to look like in order to effectively share our Catholic faith in a way that is suitable and sustainable for our children and generations to come.

The next step in this multi-year process is to hear more robustly from you, our parishioners, about our parish. The Archdiocese of St. Louis will host over 350 listening sessions throughout our 178 parishes between October 8 - November 19, 2022.



St. Joseph Parish listening sessions will be October 29th from 9-11 am or 2-4 pm

Parishioners must register in order to attend a listening session. Registration will close once the designated room's seating capacity is reached. There will not be additional opportunities for listening sessions other than the ones scheduled for each parish. Please register at https://allthingsnew.archstl.org/Ways-to-Engage/Listening-Sessions

Each listening session, including ours, will be facilitated by volunteer parishioners from a different parish. These trained facilitators will share pre-recorded messages from Archbishop Rozanski and Fr. Chris Martin, Vicar for Strategic Planning, with an overview of All Things New, a planning area overview and multiple DRAFT model options to consider for our respective planning area. A brief time will be allowed for small group discussion and facilitated large group feedback.

The goals of the listening sessions are to engage as many of you as possible in understanding the current state of our parish and diocese and to solicit feedback from as many of you as possible about the DRAFT models options for their planning area.

After the final listening session in each planning area, the Archdiocese of St. Louis will make public the content presented at all the parish's listening sessions in that planning area and will offer an additional opportunity for parishioners to provide open-ended feedback through an online survey. The survey will remain open until December 31, 2022. Parishioner feedback to the models is critical, as it will be used to help shape the future of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

In order for you to be fully prepared with accurate information before our parish listening sessions, you will receive access to our Parish Workbook. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has created Parish Workbooks as a supplementary resource to help us prepare for the listening sessions. The workbooks are meant to equip us with data about the Archdiocese of St. Louis, our local planning area, and our specific parish. Our Parish Workbook is posted on allthingsnew.archstl.org for anyone to view.

Please continue to pray for the gift of true discernment so that we may continue to do the Will of God in all things.






