From the Desk of Fr. Anthony Yates, Pastor

First Sunday of Lent

And so, it begins — the holy and, for some, daunting, season of Lent. This is the season in our liturgical year when the Church encourages us to increase our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to help us enter more deeply into the mystery of our Lord's Passion and Death and to celebrate more fully His Resurrection.

Jesus, by His own example in today's Gospel, demonstrates the necessity of setting aside a period devoted especially

to prayer and fasting as a means of strengthening our spiritual muscles. Just before the launch of His public ministry, He is "led by the Holy Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil." In imitation of Jesus, we should ask the Holy Spirit to lead us into the desert, too — the desert of our interior lives where our thoughts and desires reside.

While our Lord was strong enough to withstand the temptations of the devil on His own, we most certainly are not! We must turn to the Holy Spirit and ask Him to show us where we need to grow and then rely on the Holy Spirit for strength and guidance throughout these 40 days of growth. Perhaps we will be led to take on a spiritual reading program, or a daily time of meditation on the



Scriptures. Maybe we'll be inspired to fast from our favorite food or social media fix and find a project that serves the poor in this community.

If these spiritual exercises hurt a little, that means we are doing them right! At the end of this season, we will be prepared to enter the grace-filled days of the Triduum, and we will, through the power of the Holy Spirit, be resurrected as a new creation with our Lord come Easter.

Pride: an untrue opinion of ourselves, an untrue idea of what we are not.

Have I a superior attitude in thinking, or speaking or acting? Am I snobbish? Have I had offensive, haughty ways of acting or carrying myself? Do I hold myself above others? Do I demand recognition? Do I desire to be always first? Do I seek advice? Am I ready to accept advice? Am I in any sense a "bully"? Am I inclined to be "bossy"? Do I speak ill of others? Have I lied about others? Do I make known the faults of others? Do I seek to place the blame on others, excusing myself? Is there anyone to whom I refuse to speak? Is there anyone to whom I have not spoken for a long time? Am I prone to argue? Am I offensive in my arguments? Have I a superior "know-it-all attitude" in arguments? Am I self-conscious? Am I sensitive? Am I easily wounded? Don't forget to make a good confession this Lenten Season.





Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion

Many times in the Gospels we hear Jesus say, "Come, follow me," and people did, setting out on the path of new and eternal life. In our time, Christ's voice continues to be heard, and today a special group of people answering his call are gathering at the 8:30 a.m. Mass for the celebration of the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion. The catechumens among them are coming to publicly express their desire for baptism and the other sacraments of initiation - the Eucharist and Confirmation and will be called the "elect" chosen by God. The call to continuing conversion concerns the candidates preparing either for confirmation and/or Eucharist or reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church. They will meet at the Cathedral Basilica this afternoon for the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion by Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski.

As we accompany our catechumens and candidates in this journey and support them with our prayers and encouragement, each of us can respond positively to that divine voice in our hearts, rededicate ourselves to our baptismal promises and deepen our own faith with a life of ongoing conversion.






